When to call 999?

You should always call 999 in a life-threatening emergency: heavy bleeding, chest pain, collapse or losing consciousness, extensive/major burns, sudden facial or limb weakness, seizures, spinal injury, floppy unwell infant, severe allergic reaction, poisoning or overdose, headache with loss of consciousness all need 999.

If you are unsure what to do, dial 111 to be directed.



BOWEL CANCER AWARENESS

No-one likes talking about the subject, but did you know that bowel cancer is one of the most common cancers in the UK, so it's important that we do keep talking about it and know when to get help with unusual bowel symptoms.

If you have any of the symptoms in the image, we want you to get in touch. Early detection of anything that needs treating will almost certainly lead to a better outcome and more treatment options.

BOWEL SCREENING

National bowel cancer screening has now been extended to include anyone aged 50 to 74 years, with callups every 2 years. You will be sent a

ups every 2 years. You will be sent a FREE at-home test which is easy to do. Once completed, you then post this back to the service for testing.

The test is called a faecal immunochemical test (FIT) to look for blood in a sample of your poo. This could be a sign of bowel cancer.

If blood is found in your poo, it does not always mean you have cancer. There are more common and less serious causes of blood in your poo, such as an anal fissure or bowel polyps.

If you're aged 75 or over, you can ask for a home test kit every 2 years by calling the bowel cancer screening helpline on **0800 707 6060**.

Just a reminder that if you are currently receiving tax credits from HMRC, these will no longer be paid after **5th April 2025.**

People receiving tax credits are being moved to Universal credit, so, to continue being entitled to free NHS prescriptions, you must now meet the Universal Credit criteria for help with health costs.

You can check if you are entitled to help with health costs before you claim, by using the eligibility checker on the NHS website:

As it is not an automatic switchover, please make sure you check first and apply if necessary, otherwise you **may be liable to charges.**
